ATTACHMENT C

NORTH COAST SECTION EJECTION POLICY SOCCER 2007-2008

The following is a summary of the rules pertaining to the NCS Ejection Policy in soccer. This summary is provided for athletic directors, coaches and league commissioners. Athletes and coaches may be disqualified from competition for many reasons according to National Federation rules. This summary outlines which rules will apply to the NCS Ejection Policy. **Please review these rules with your coaches and student athletes.** However, any act by an athlete or coach that is unsportsmanlike or dangerous conduct shall subject the student or coach to ejection and application of the NCS Ejection Policy. It is important to note that a one game or contest ejection is not a substitute for appropriate counseling of the student or the coach, nor for the student's or coach's demonstrated contrition and acceptance of responsibility for the action(s) which led to the ejection. The one game or contest suspension is the universal penalty for ejection from a contest but in no way is it a substitute for a school's and coach's responsibility to provide appropriate counseling, remedial action, and discipline. Each league shall establish a procedure for reporting ejections (NCS Sports & General Rulings Handbook - bylaw 307H).

Coaches Review Content

League commissioners shall have coaches review the content of the Ejection Policy for the coaches' respective sport at the end of the season meeting and make recommendations for change. The league commissioner will direct such recommendations to the NCS Sports Advisory Committee ("SAC"), which will consider them. The SAC will determine whether to forward recommendations to the Board of Managers for change.
(Board of Managers 10/24/97)

School Administration and Coaches' Responsibility

School administrators and coaches are responsible for determining the cause of ejection for any coach or player and are responsible for enforcement of the Ejection Policy. Confusion over the cause for a coach's or player's ejection shall not be the basis for allowing a student who has been ejected under an applicable rule to avoid the sanctions required by the Ejection Policy (either prohibition from participation or forfeiture should a student or coach who is in violation of the Ejection Policy participates in a subsequent contest).
(Board of Managers 10/24/97)

Note: Any act by an athlete that is unsportsmanlike or dangerous conduct shall subject the student to ejection from the contest and application of the NCS Ejection Policy will apply.

Basketball Proposal C – New Division & 16 team brackets

Rationale

Beginning 1989, the State CIF Basketball Championships have been conducted in five (5) divisions in both boys and girls based upon enrollment. During the past eighteen (18) years, there have been a few minor adjustments to the format. In 2003 schools were prohibited from opting up to higher division by Federate Council action in all sports. In basketball, the northern California management committee made the decision to allow San Francisco and Oakland two entries and to play out bracket games as needed. In 2004 out bracket games were added to the southern California regional when needed. During the past two decades, the number of CIF schools has increased and number of schools participating in basketball has increased significantly as validated by the latest participation survey recently completed.

All CIF Sections have seen significant growth in both the number of member schools and participants yet the number of entries has increased by only 20 teams with the addition of the out bracket games.

The present playoff structure does not meet the needs of CIF member schools as it has not evolved with this tremendous growth. In addition, the financial and travel concerns that face the CIF and its member schools must be considered when making revisions to the present system. Across the state, many schools desire to compete at the highest level of competition, regardless of enrollment. There also must be a balance in place that ensures that schools with smaller enrollments are competing with those of like interests and expectations.

With these above stated facts, the following proposal is forwarded for your consideration.

- A. Divisional placement of CIF member schools participating in the CIF Basketball playoffs shall be determined by the CIF Section that they represent. Sections divisional placement of schools is at the sole discretion of the section. There shall be an enrollment cap in divisions IV-V. *(Caps to be established)*
- ~~B. Teams will enter their respective regional playoff regardless of section affiliation.~~
- C. A "New Division" shall be comprised of the top eight seeded teams from each region of the state as determined by the respective seeding committee. The teams shall be selected by the seeding committee regardless of their enrollment. The New Division shall play on Wednesday, Saturday, Saturday and Finals weekend.

New Division – As determined by the seeding committee.

Division I – As determined by Section participation.

Division II – As determined by Section participation.

Division III – As determined by Section participation.

Division IV – As determined by Section participation, enrollment may not exceed 1000(**recommend commissioners determine caps**)

Division V – As determined by Section participation, enrollment may not exceed 500(**recommend commissioners determine caps**)

Administrative Operations

Tournament played over a 3 week period. Extends the season by one week for 360 of the 79,713 participating student-athletes (0.4%) and 24 of the 2,609 (0.9%) teams. Reduces the number of school nights out to either one or two for students and may reduce missed class time for traveling teams.

“New” Division

The top Eight (8) teams in the each regional will be advanced to the “New Division” regardless of enrollment and/or division. The teams will be selected by a vote of the seeding committee. *(A sub-committee will establish the selection protocol/process prior to the formal proposal moving forward. i.e. committee must select a section champion prior to selecting the runner-up from the same division.)*

Division I-V

- A. In Division I-V, there will be a maximum 16 team brackets. Each section is guaranteed two entries per division in which they host section playoffs. The two section guaranteed entries will be placed in either the Northern or Southern Regional, depending upon geographical location of the entry.
- B. All entries into the maximum 16 team bracket will be pre-determined. *(A sub-committee will establish a formula for the additional entries prior to the proposal moving forward.)*
- C. Section entries will be capped at no more than 8 per division.

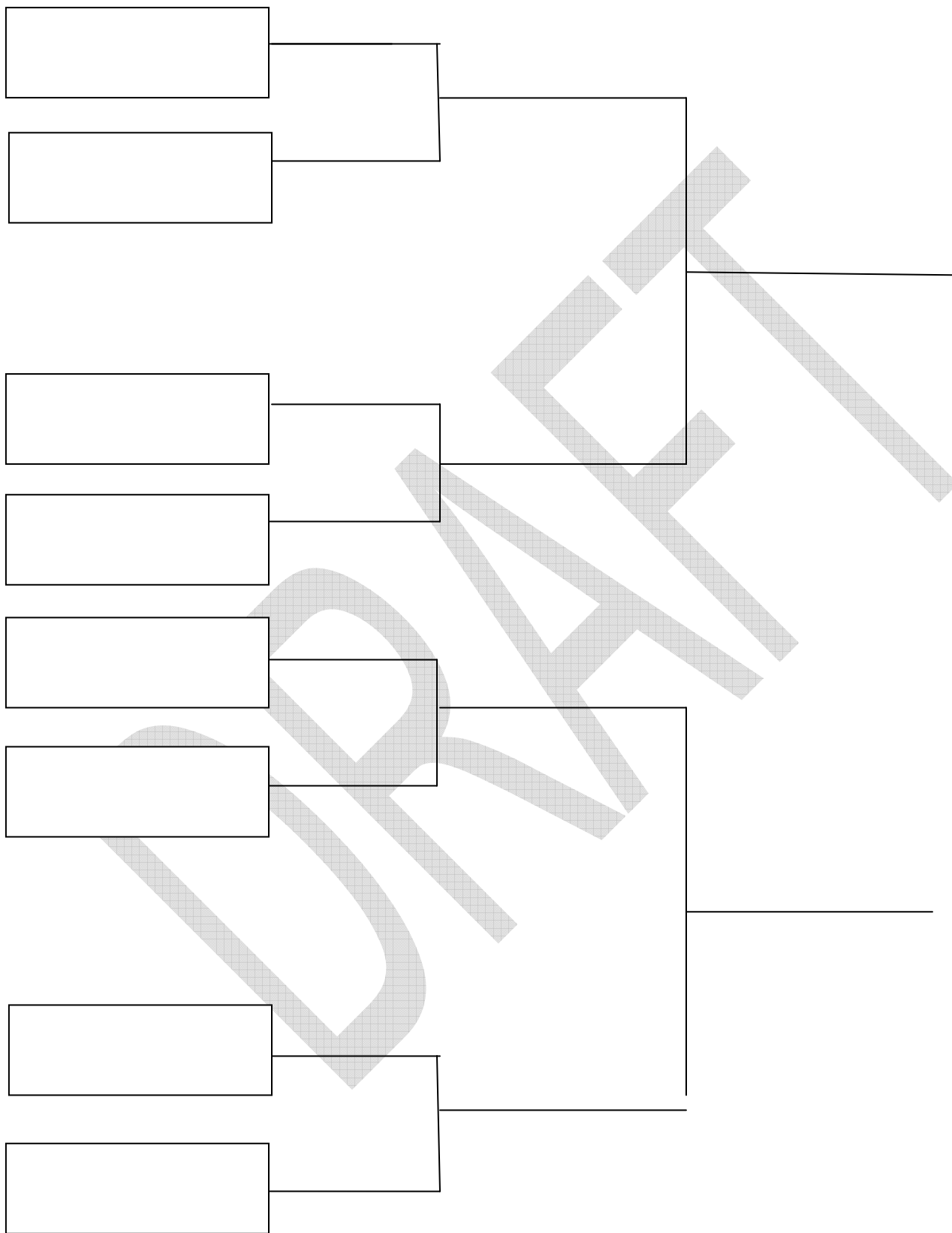

League Commissioner Reminders

- League Commissioners are encouraged to forward SAC items to the NCS Office no later than Friday, February 1, 2008 for inclusion in the March 10, 2008 SAC agenda. NCS staff would like to mail the agenda the following week. Agenda items must be in the form of a motion and include rationale. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.
- If your league has not forwarded the names of winter at-large & seeding committees please do so immediately. NCS staff has information to send to each member. In addition, NCS staff sometimes must change the meeting they were originally assigned. We need as much advance notice as possible. Thanks in advance for your cooperation! ***Don't forget that NCS does not need previously requested seeding committee members for basketball. More information is included below.***
- As of today, NCS/Les Schwab Tires Championship Bulletins in the sports of tennis (individual and team), spring soccer, lacrosse, baseball, softball, volleyball, diving, swimming and badminton have been delivered to league commissioners via today's NCS Board of Managers Meeting. The Regional and MOC golf and Class A/Area and MOC Track & Field will be mailed directly to schools.
- Rulebook orders for the 2007-08 school year will be mailed to league commissioners in the next few weeks. It is important that when schools order that they evaluate carefully how many they need. When NCS staff is requested to order books just prior to a season the ordering school incurs extra costs for the books in addition to expensive shipping and handling.
- The League Commissioner's Workshop will take place on Monday and Tuesday, August 11th and 12th. NCS staff had looked at moving the workshop later since the calendar is generally later next school year. However, many schools are still starting at earlier dates and the above dates reduce those school conflicts.
- Included with your materials today are the NCS/Les Schwab Tires Wrestling entry forms. Please distribute these forms to your league tournament director prior to your league championship. Additional information will be sent in the next couple of weeks.

NCS/LES SCHWAB TIRES BASKETBALL CHAMPIONSHIPS

NCS staff is making final arrangements on sites to be used during the NCS/Les Schwab Tires Basketball Championships. Arrangements include the possible use of the Oakland Oracle Arena, St. Mary's College, College of Marin and other high schools with facilities with larger seating capacities and locations approximate to potential higher seeded teams in the championship round. Cal State East Bay will not be used this year based on management interference at the site. If NCS is not able to secure the Oakland Oracle Arena NCS staff will ask the NCS Executive Committee to allow finals to be played on either Friday or Saturday, February 29 and March 1. Championship dates (two-week format) are as follows:

NCS BASKETBALL AT-LARGE & SEEDING COMMITTEE

NCS staff have arranged for twelve individuals (two from each NCS conference) to participate in the process of selection of at-large teams for the NCS Basketball Championships and seeding of the tournament. Each participant has been sent information concerning their responsibilities, meeting date and internet locations where they can track potential teams, review records, head to head competition, common opponents, etc.

A letter will be sent to NCS basketball coaches outlining their responsibilities for participation in the NCS

Basketball Championships. In summary, the following will take place up to and on Sunday, February 17th:

- Potential teams forward their intention to participate by sending their At-large & Seeding Form to the NCS Office no later than 9:00 a.m., Sunday, February 17th.
- NCS Basketball At-large & Seeding Committee will meet Sunday, February 17th at 9:00 a.m.
- Brackets will be posted as they are developed, as early as 10:30 a.m.
- The NCS Office will open for pick-up of materials at 1:00 p.m. and stay open until 6:00 p.m.
- A representative/coach from hosting schools* is required to come to the NCS Office and pick-up their materials
 - Those representative/coaches who purchase souvenirs up to and on Sunday, February 17th will receive a 5% discount on team orders \$250 or more.
 - Hosting materials will include Gate Bag, both home and visiting team basketballs and visiting team participation certificates.
 - NCS staff encourages schools to work with each other to pick-up materials/souvenirs.
 - *Schools from the HDNL and CMC are not required to pick-up materials but are welcome. These materials will be either shipped or other arrangements may be made for these participating schools to pick-up materials in the Eureka area.
 - Visiting schools may pick-up materials (coaches' packet, basketball and purchase souvenirs) if they wish. Visiting school Coaches' Packet will be posted on the NCS website.
- Following the conclusion of the season a survey of NCS basketball coaches will be conducted to receive their input regarding the selection of teams and seeding of the tournament.

NCS/LES SCHWAB TIRES WRESTLING CHAMPIONSHIPS

In just a couple of weeks the NCS/Les Schwab Tires Wrestling Championship season kicks off competition with the NCS/Les Schwab Tires Dual Team Wrestling Championships. Competition will be held in four classifications at two sites Saturday, February 9, 2008. The Class A and Redwood Empire will be conducted at Windsor High School (Windsor) and the 2A and 3A East Bay will be conducted at Liberty High School (Brentwood).

Individual competition for boys and girls will take place Friday and Saturday, February 22 and 23, 2008 for boys at Newark Memorial High School (Newark) and Saturday, February 23, 2008 for girls at John F. Kennedy High School (Fremont).

A letter is being sent to all wrestling coaches reminding them of upcoming deadlines, reminders about NFHS rules and general information concerning the NCS/Les Schwab Tires Wrestling Championship Series.
