"It is the mission of the North Coast Section to provide wholesome, educational athletic activities that foster the ideals of sportsmanship, ethical conduct and fair play. All competition and practices shall be conducted in a safe manner that assures dignity, respect and courtesy for players, coaches, officials and spectators." (Board of Managers - April 26, 1996)

300H Sportsmanship**Sportsmanship Preamble**

The member schools of the *North Coast Section*, CIF are committed to providing a sportsmanlike environment for students, coaches, and spectators. To that end, the *NCS Board of Managers* has adopted sportsmanship and crowd control recommendations. Each member school is encouraged to ~~commit itself to~~ implementing these recommendations *and commit to the enforcement of proper spectator behavior at all contests conducted at their home location and while visiting other contest locations.*

Repeated violations of sportsmanship standards may result in loss of hosting NCS and CIF Championship events. All concerns regarding violations of sportsmanship standards should be reported to the NCS Office.

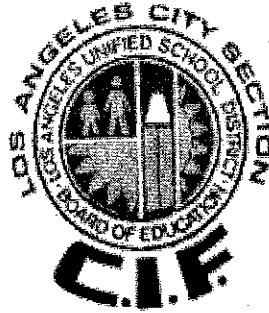
Definition of Sportsmanship

A person who can take a loss or defeat without complaint, or victory without gloating, and who treats his/her opponents with fairness, courtesy and respect

- a) The following are expected to be role models demonstrating sportsmanship at all times:
 - 1) Principal/administrative staff
 - 2) Athletic directors
 - 3) Coaches, players and cheerleaders
 - 4) Faculty members
 - 5) Booster club members
 - 6) Band director
- b) Coaches, players, cheerleaders, *parents* and spectators will respect the integrity and judgment of sports officials.
- c) The conduct of coaches, players and cheerleaders generally sets the tone of *NCS/CIF* contests. They will be expected to maintain the highest level of decorum at all *NCS/CIF* contests.
- d) The following behavior is unacceptable at all *NCS/CIF* high school contest:
 - 1) Berating your opponent's school or mascot
 - 2) Berating, *yelling, booing or chanting at* opposing players or coaches before, during and after the game. Personal attacks will not be tolerated.
 - 3) Obscene cheers or gestures
 - 4) Negative signs. *All signs must show only positive support. Those which direct negative comments towards opponents or are unsportsmanlike or vulgar are not permitted.*
 - 5) Noisemakers (*Artificial noisemakers shall not be used at any event. Artificial noisemakers are items such as, but not limited to, megaphones, air horns, bells, whistles, clickers, thunder sticks, explosive devices, tape/CD players, jars with pennies, drums, large water bottles, conch shells, plastic horns and radios.*)
 - 6) Laser pointers
 - 7) Complaining about officials' calls (verbal or gestures)
 - 8) *Throwing objects onto the playing area before, during, or after a contest.*
 - 9) *Entering the playing area before and during a contest, including the awards ceremony, if applicable.*
- e) *The following behavior is questionable behavior which schools may want to discourage and must be closely monitored by site administration.*
 - 1) *Demeaning acts such as actions, or gestures (ex: turning backward during introductions, holding up newspapers)*
 - 2) *Doing crowd initiated yells instead of following the lead of cheerleaders*
 - 3) *Yells such as "Air Ball" or "You, You, You".*
 - 3) *Spectators attire, including shirtless with messages painted on their bare skin, should be closely monitored.*
 - 4) *Bringing objects, such as brooms, newspapers, etc., used to demean your opponent.*
 - 5) *Entering the playing area after a contest prior to team handshakes or the opponents' safe return to their team area.*
- f) *Student attendance is not a right, but a privilege. Site management/supervision has the right to remove any individual for not adhering to NCS and school rules/policies. (Penal Code 626.6)*

- e) The following action plans are recommended:
- 1) *et Hth student leaders prior to games where student attendance is expected to exceed regular attendance to review proper behavior at all games*
 - 2) A script should be provided to the announcer including:
 - * Welcome
 - * Sportsmanlike expectations
 - * Acknowledgment and introduction of the game officials

NOTE: There should be a short statement endorsing the officials as neutral persons who have been accredited by the CIF.
 - 3) Include the CIF Code of Ethics in the game programs.
 - 4) Each participating school's administration is expected to emphasize sportsmanlike behavior at all CIF contests.
 - * This shall be directed to coaches, players, cheerleaders and spectators in the day(s) prior to the contest.
 - * Rallies, team meetings, faculty meetings, spirit club meetings, school bulletins and P.A. announcements are all appropriate venues.
 - * Contact the principal or administrator-in-charge of the opponent's school at least one day prior to basketball and football games and other contests as appropriate to promote practical applications of the sportsmanship and to ensure the proper environment for the contest.
 - 5) It is the responsibility of the administration of each participating school to designate an administrative representative who will:
 - * Check in with the site manager 30 minutes prior to the game time and establish where he/she will be throughout the contest, and
 - * Enforce the highest standards of sportsmanship with his/her own student body, and
 - * Contact the administrative representative of the opponent's school to report any violations of sportsmanship by either school's supporters.

CIF LOS ANGELES CITY SECTION
Proposal for CIF Southern California Regional Boys' Volleyball Championships

As per approval of the CIF Los Angeles City Section governing board on April 23, 2007, the following proposal is forwarded to the Championships and New Events Committee of the California Interscholastic Federation (CIF) as the first step in the State CIF process for possible implementation. The proposal is to request the California Interscholastic Federation to administer a Southern California Regional Championship for Boys' Volleyball, to include the Central, Southern, Los Angeles and San Diego Sections to begin in the spring of 2009. It is understood that any proposal for the addition of a new championship under the auspices of the California Interscholastic Federation must follow the criteria and procedures for new events, as specified by the CIF Federated Council.

SUMMARY OF PROPOSED CIF SOCAL REGIONAL BOYS' VOLLEYBALL TOURNAMENT

1. Format

The proposed format is an eight-team single elimination tournament in each of the three divisions for boys, (a statewide tournament already exists for girls) with the first round to be held during the week immediately following the four Sections' Boys' Volleyball Championships to begin in May, 2009. Entries into the tournament will be the champions of the four sections, as well as at-large selections to fill the open brackets in each of the three divisions, for a total of 24 entries.

2. Management

The CIF SoCal Regional Boys' Volleyball Championships will be under the responsibility of the CIF SoCal Boys' Volleyball Management Committee, to be determined through the process as delineated by the State CIF Office. The Management Committee is to include but not limited to representation from all four sections.

3. Regional Tournament Dates

The CIF SoCal Boys' Volleyball Championship dates will be May 30, June 2 and June 6, 2009. Based on review by the Championships and New Events Committee, consideration may be given alternate dates that meet the criteria and time frame for the event based on Section Championships, and the Memorial Day weekend.

4. Participants

Central Section
Southern Section
Los Angeles Section
San Diego Section

5. Classification System for Placement in SoCal Championships

There will be three divisions based on enrollment to be pre-determined by the State CIF. It is recommended to utilize enrollment divisions determined by a three-way division number of participating schools within the SoCal Region, consistent with the method used to determine enrollment divisions for the State Girls' Volleyball Championships.

6. Number of Entries from Each Section

The total number of entries from each section is to be based on the proportionate number of schools participating in Boys' Volleyball, per section. Section champions will be given automatic entry. In the event sections have more champions than available number of entries, the determination of entries must be made by the individual section.

7. Seeding Committee

The Seeding Committee will be composed of the four Section Commissioners and the Tournament Director, as determined by the State CIF Office.

8. Sites

The first round and semi-final games will be played at the school designated as the "home team". When possible, each section champion will receive a home game in the first round.

The location (or locations) of the Regional Championship games is to be determined through the RFP (Request for Proposal) process as per the State CIF Office. Suggested sites for the SoCal Regionals would include, but not be limited to: UCLA, USC, CSUN, Cal State Long Beach University, Pepperdine University, and additional sites in the surrounding area.

POLICY AND PROCEDURES FOR NEW EVENTS

The criteria specified by the CIF Federated Council for proposals of new events to be managed by the California Interscholastic Federation is addressed below.

1. Financial Criteria

- A. Travel expenses, lodging and meals: First round pairings will be made with consideration of travel time and expense. During the first and second rounds, the visiting teams will be responsible for their own travel expenses, to include transportation, meals, and lodging, if required, subject to reimbursement. Host schools will be provided a flat amount to cover basic expenses. It is expected that since only the four southern California sections are participating, the cost for lodging will be minimal.

- B. Mitigating expenses of a new event: In order to minimize expense (and loss of school time), In the first round of each division, the seeding committee will consider geography when determining brackets. The first round and semi-finals will be played at home sites.
- C. Financial burden on Section and State budgets: The financial burden the sections and/or State may incur must be off-set, wholly or partially, through the use of funding sources to include, but not be limited to: ticket sales, television and internet broadcast rights fees, and contributing corporate sponsors. Other than current relationships with television broadcast stations. Additional corporate sponsors will be pursued upon approval of the event proposal.

a. Detailed, specific, feasible cost estimate: A detailed, specific, feasible total cost estimate can only be submitted upon the selection of the site of the Regional Championship. There are several feasible sites located in the southern California area, which include a wide range of fees, dependent on the level of the venue to be selected. The selection of the venue is also dependent on the funds that can be obtained through sponsorship of the event, which can only be determined if the proposal is preliminarily approved through the CIF process.

The figures below are estimates of the expenses for the two preliminary rounds, including The number of school that may need to travel over 120 miles, and the number of schools that may need lodging. The number of allowable persons in the traveling party is 30 per school.

2. Philosophical criteria: The addition of a SoCal Regional Boys' Volleyball Championship will continue to enhance the awareness of positive values taught through sport participation, including the opportunity for athletes to excel on the court while also adhering to the principals of "Pursuing Victory with Honor." Secondly, the event will elevate the sport of boys' volleyball in the high school community, and add credibility to the sport, as played at the championship level. Thirdly, the event will give boys the opportunity to return (the boys' volleyball state championship was discontinued in the 1970's) to play at the state level that girls already have. Fourth, at the university

level, as of March 2007, 5 of the top ten ranked men's NCAA teams are located in Southern California. Lastly, the sport of volleyball in southern California features athletes that represent a high level of diversity.

3. **Qualifying participation criterion for a championship event:** According to the 2004-2005 CIF Participation Survey; more than 256 of all CIF member schools in the Central, Southern, Los Angeles, and San Diego Sections participates in the sport of Boys' Volleyball. Participants in these sections represented 10,239 of the 13,331 athletes participating statewide (76.8%). Also, according to the survey at that time there was an 8% increase in the number of participants statewide. The Los Angeles Section has increased 14% in number of teams from the time of the survey to the 2007 season. With the number of new schools in that section and other sections scheduled for opening in the coming years that percentage will continue to increase.
4. **Feasibility:** It is the opinion of the CIF Los Angeles City Section Boys' Volleyball community that this event is feasible and can be managed by a competent staff by continuing the staff functions of facilitating Section Championships, in coordination with State CIF staff. Although attendance at Boys' Volleyball matches can be marginal at times, it is also true that championship matches in Southern California are highly attended. A CIF sponsored championship will serve to enhance the growth of Boys' Volleyball. It is understood that a new event must be financially supported and sustained over a period of years. Consequently, proper planning must go into establishing a solid base of financial and school based support in order to allow the event the opportunity to sustain itself.
5. **Other recommendations:** The benefits of a SoCal Regional Boys' Volleyball Championship will exceed the financial expense of such an event. A championship of this caliber will reinforce boys' volleyball as a major high school sport, and will give student athletes the opportunity to excel at the highest level possible in their high school careers. The event will have almost no impact on individual participating schools, as this event will take place in a one-week time. Other ancillary events can be included on the "Regional Championship Weekend", such as a coaching clinic, referee's clinic for the purpose of recruiting new officials, college informational booths, recognition of model coaches, scholar athletes and teams, and provision of sportsmanship awards.

- Final proposal submitted to IAC for approval by April 23, 2007
- Proposal submitted to State CIF Championships and New Events Committee (CNEC) by May 1, 2007
- CNEC reviews proposal by June 1, 2007
- Commissioners review proposal mid-June, 2007
- Presented to Federated Council for First Reading in November, 2007
- Processed as an "Action Item" at Federated Council in February (or May), 2008
- Plans put in place to hold tournament in May/June, 2009

SAC AD-HOC COMMITTEE TO REVIEW THE AT-LARGE & SEEDING PROCESS

The SAC Ad-Hoc Committee to Review the NCS At-large & Seeding Process will meet next Tuesday, April 29th at Marin Catholic High School in Kentfield. NCS staff has invited individuals from every league.

The committee's recommendation to use two committees to select at-large teams and seed each division of the NCS Basketball Championships, approved by the SAC and Board of Managers in the fall, appears to have been very successful, based on comments from SAC members and coaches surveyed following the championships. Any recommendations from the committee will be forwarded to the NCS Sports Advisory Committee's September 8th meeting. Recommendations from the SAC will be forwarded to the BOM in October.

NCS/LES SCHWAB TIRES WINTER CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES EVENTS

The NCS/Les Schwab Tires Winter Championships – Presented by Farmers, were extremely successful. The winter season started with 36 wrestling teams vying for four Class/Area Championships. Windsor and Liberty High Schools were used as sites for some great competition. Congratulations to all of the participating schools.

Winter soccer was next with 48 boys and girls teams competing in less than perfect weather. Despite the weather the attendance was outstanding and hundreds of spectators saw some great competition.

The individual boys and girls wrestling championships were well conducted and included great competition. The girls' tournament saw an increase in competitors from 2007. The boys' tournament included 476 boys competing for four berths to the State CIF Championships in each weight class and the semifinals and championship matches were streamed live on the NCS website. NCS had several medal winners at the State Wrestling Championships, including three individual champions.

The NCS/Les Schwab Tires Basketball Championships was very competitive with 128 teams participating. Championship games were played at the ORACLE Arena in Oakland (six games), St. Mary's College in Moraga (two games) and College of Marin in Kentfield (two games). College of Marin was a sellout, with some second game spectators standing outside until the last four minutes of the game. Of the advancing teams to the Nor-Cal CIF Championships eight teams made the Nor-Cal finals with five going on to the State CIF Basketball Championships at ARCO Arena. NCS had three teams win State Championships. The income at the ORACLE Arena for the six games played was \$30,000 higher than 2006, where a one-week format was in use. It appears that the two-week format has increased the attendance to NCS games as the income the last two years has been significantly higher than previous years, topping more than \$311,000 this year.

NCS/LES SCHWAB TIRES SPRING CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES EVENTS

- **Baseball** – NCS is in the process of signing an agreement with Oakland McAfee Coliseum Joint Venture to play four baseball games at the Oakland Coliseum. After placing the four games at the Coliseum the remaining games will be played in the geographical area of the higher seeded team.
- **Badminton** - The NCS/Les Schwab Tires Badminton Championships will be conducted at Newark Memorial High School in Newark, Saturday, May 17th.
- **Lacrosse** – The NCS/Les Schwab Tires Lacrosse Championships location is TBA to date. Tentative arrangements

have been made at Dublin High School. The championship date is Saturday, May 17th.

- **Soccer** – The NCS/Les Schwab Tires Spring Soccer Championships will be conducted at Marin Catholic High School, Saturday, May 17th at a time to be announced.

Entry letters have been sent to each NCS member school conducting the sport of swimming. The letter contains each school's username and password for entry using the Direct Athletics website. Two separate letters were sent to each school. One to the AD and one to the head swimming coach.

North Coast Section continues to work with Children's Hospital and Research Center Oakland to provide approved medical personnel at all NCS/Les Schwab Tires Championship events except golf, swimming, tennis and badminton. Forty-five individuals have registered in the program. Interested individuals must be licensed in one of the NCS approved medical areas (M.D., ATC, EMT or Paramedic, and must provide their own liability coverage. During this past winter championship season almost 100% of NCS Championships were covered by an approved medical person
