1606 CBEDS PARAMETERS

A. ENROLLMENT RANGES DIVISION PLACEMENT OF SCHOOLS

Division placement of CIF member schools participating in the CIF basketball playoffs shall be determined by that school's previous year CBEDS, grades 9-12. (for schools with 10-12 enrollment only, the 10th grade enrollment shall be doubled). For single gender schools, the total enrollment will be doubled. Each CIF Section must establish enrollment ranges for their basketball playoffs, Division I-V, that fall within the following CBEDS parameters:

Division ranges would need to be adjusted by the CIF Basketball Committee.

Article 17 CROSS COUNTRY

1700 CBEDS PARAMETERS

A. Enrollment Ranges DIVISION PLACEMENT OF SCHOOLS

Division placement of CIF member schools participating in the CIF cross country championships shall be determined by that school's previous year CBEDS, grades 9-12 (for schools with 10-12 enrollment only, the 10th grade enrollment shall be doubled). For single gender schools, the total enrollment will be doubled. Each CIF Section must establish enrollment ranges for their cross country championships, Division I-V, that fall within the following CBEDS parameters:

Division ranges would need to be adjusted by the CIF Cross Country Committee.

Article 29 VOLLEYBALL

2902 CBEDS PARAMETERS

A. Enrollment Ranges DIVISION PLACEMENT OF SCHOOLS

Division placement of CIF member schools participating in the CIF volleyball playoffs shall be determined by that school's previous year CBEDS, grades 9-12 (for schools with 10-12 enrollment only, the 10th grade enrollment shall be doubled). For single gender schools, the total enrollment will be doubled. Each CIF Section must establish enrollment ranges for their volleyball championships, Division I-V, that fall within the following CBEDS parameters: Division ranges would need to be adjusted by the CIF Volleyball Committee.

Proposed Tie Game Procedure

When the score is tied at the end of regulation time, the referee will instruct both teams to return to their respective team areas. There will be five minutes during which both teams may confer with their coaches, and the head referee will instruct both teams as the proper procedure.

1. There shall be two, if necessary, 10-minute "sudden win" overtime periods. The first team to score during either 10-minute "sudden win" overtime period will be declared the winner.
2. If the score still remains tied, all coaches, officials and team captains shall assemble at the halfway line to review the procedure as outlined for penalty kicks as outlined in the NFHS Soccer Rulebook until a winner is declared.

A. State Championship Football Bowl proposal (Attachment A)

FAILED 10-12-2

A proposal to add a state championship in football commencing in December 2006 is presented for a 1st reading.

Attached is a proposal to add a state championship in football beginning in December 2006. Since this proposal was first introduced it has gone through several revisions and has been discussed at several meetings of the CIF Executive Committee, Championships, New Events Committee and the Commissioner's Committee.

In addition, the Championships, New Events Committee asked to include:

The most frequently asked questions and responses to those questions;

Background and timeline of the proposal;

Statistical data using a "dry run" for the past three (3) years that indicates the number of sections having qualifying schools, the number of different schools that would have qualified and the number of private and public schools that would have qualified; and

All qualifying schools by division for the past three (3) years.

The committee asks that this proposal be voted on in May giving staff and committee members time from November to April to visit with sections, leagues, and conferences to answer any questions.

B. Ejection Policy: State Championships

NO ACTION

A uniform policy for ejections leading to and during state championship play is being proposed. This proposal would still allow a section that needs or wants to be more restrictive.

CIF CHAMPIONSHIPS EJECTION POLICY

A. Coaches' Responsibility

Coaches are responsible for determining the cause of ejection for any of their players and are responsible for enforcement of the Ejection Policy. Confusion over the cause for a player's ejection shall not be the basis for allowing a student who has been ejected under an applicable rule to avoid the sanctions required by the Ejection Policy (either prohibition from participation or forfeiture should a student who is in violation of the Ejection Policy play in a subsequent contest).

B. Penalties

1. These rules and minimum penalties are applicable to players and coaches during the time that contest officials have jurisdiction for the contest in accordance with National Federation or sport governing body rules for the respective sport.

a. Players: Ejection of player from a contest for unsportsmanlike or dangerous conduct.

Penalties: Any player suspended for the season by his/her league or Section is ineligible for CIF post-season competition. A player ejected from his/her team's previous contest, beginning with the finals of Section Championship competition, for dangerous or unsportsmanlike actions, shall be ineligible for the school's next contest in the CIF post-season playoffs. A student who was ejected from his/her team's previous contest for dangerous or unsportsmanlike actions shall not be allowed to dress in his/her team's uniform, but will remain the responsibility of school personnel if the student attends the next contest.

b. Coaches: Ejection of coaches, assistant coaches and/or coaching representatives.

Penalty: The coach, assistant coach and/or coaching representative will immediately remove themselves from their coaching responsibilities in accordance with National Federation or sport governing rules for the respective sport. The coach, assistant coach and/or coaching representative must leave the vicinity of the playing area immediately and is prohibited from any contact, direct or indirect, with the team players and other team personnel during the remainder of the game. If there is no other coaching representative who is certified by the school in accordance to CIF bylaw 506, the game shall be terminated and declared a forfeit. The offending

coach's school will be credited with a loss and the opposing school shall be credited with a win. The ejected coach, assistant coach and/or coaching representative will be prohibited from coaching or attending the next interscholastic contest for that team or any other team in the same sport prior to serving the penalty.

c. *Illegal participation in the next contest by a player or coach, assistant coach and/or coaching representative ejected in a previous contest.*

Penalty: The contest shall be forfeited and the ineligible player, coach, assistant coach and/or coaching representative shall be ineligible for the first contest in the next season. During the contest for which the player is ineligible, the player shall not be allowed to dress in his/her team's uniform, but will remain the responsibility of school personnel. Ejected coaches, assistant coaches and/or coaching representatives are not allowed to attend the school's next contest. If, in the next contest, there is no other coaching representative who is certified by the school in accordance to CIF bylaw 506, the game shall be declared a forfeit. The offending school will be credited with a loss and the opposing school shall be credited with a win.

d. *Second ejection of a player for unsportsmanlike or dangerous conduct or of a coach from a contest during one season.*

Penalty: The player shall be ineligible for the remainder of the season. The penalty for a second ejection for a coach, assistant coach and/or coaching representative shall be that the coach, assistant coach and/or coaching representative shall be prohibited from coaching or attending any CIF post-season contests for which the team qualifies.

D. Appeals

1. *Only appeals related to the factual situation of the player's or coach's ejection will be heard. Such appeals will only be made to penalties related to subsequent penalties after the ejection, they will not have jurisdiction to change the status of the player's or coach's ejection from the game in question. No appeal will be heard related to the official's judgment (other than an incorrect identification). When additional forfeitures are applied because a coach, student-athlete, school, etc. do not apply the rule and an ineligible student or coach, assistant coach and/or coaching representative participates, no appeal based on CIF Bylaw 1109 will be allowed.*

2. *Appeals for ejections from a Section championship competition shall be heard through the ejected student's or coach's Section. Appeals of ejections from State CIF competition (Nor Cal, So Cal, or State) may be made through the State CIF appeals procedure.*

E. Awards Ceremony

Any student or coach, assistant coach and/or coaching representative who has been ejected from a championship contest will be prohibited from participating in the awards ceremony.

C. Revision CIF Bylaw 1200

FAILED 0-24-0

The Southern Section is proposing a revision of this bylaw that would allow sections to set their own criteria when to add an adopted CIF sport. Bylaw 1200 states in part "The addition or deletion from the list of approved sports is subject to Federated Council approval." Under part A it states "All of the above listed CIF approved sports are to be listed in CIF Section Bylaws, and interscholastic competition in approved sports shall be conducted under CIF rules."

Southern Section, in 1983 adopted rule 1200.1 that states (in part), "No sport will be added until such time as 20% of the total senior high school membership in the CIF Southern Section participates, ..." The CIF Executive Director, after examination of the rule, believes that Southern Section's 1200.1 is in conflict with CIF Bylaw 1200. The Section's position has been that it is more restrictive as permitted under Bylaw 23. The Section has interpreted rule 1200 as being permissive with regards to the conduct of a sport, once it has been adopted and placed on the state approved list. It was never considered to be prescriptive requiring section schools to offer the sport. Southern Section Bylaw 1200.1 allows the section to conduct a survey of the member schools, and when a significant number (20%) of schools offer the sport, it is added to the section's approved list.

CIF Bylaw 1200

- A. A section may not approve or conduct competition in a non-CIF approved sport without Federated Council approval. (Revised May 2000 Federated Council)
- B. Approved interscholastic sports are: badminton, baseball, basketball, cross country, field hockey, football, golf, gymnastics, lacrosse, skiing, soccer, softball, swimming and diving, tennis, track and field, volleyball, water polo and wrestling. (Note: snowboarding is an approved event within the sport of skiing.) (Lacrosse approved February, 2001 Federated Council.)
- C. The addition or deletion from the list of approved sports is subject to Federation Council approval.
(1) All of the above listed approved sports are to be listed in CIF Section Bylaws, and interscholastic competition in approved sports shall be conducted under CIF rules.
(2) All sports or events not listed as approved CIF sports need not be conducted under CIF rules or jurisdiction.

Dear Marie:

I have reviewed your letter, dated September 29, 2003, and have discussed our options with Ms. Nancy Veilleux, CIF Sac-Joaquin Section President. We are re-submitting our proposal to the New Events Committee with the following changes:

- We support the inclusion of a third “championship” game to be played. The divisions can be determined by dividing the number of schools into three groups based on the number of schools that play football. John Williams had a conversation with Calpreps.com and they stated that the breakdown for three divisions could be as follows: Division III (0-900); Division II (901-1500); and Division I (1501+). The CBEDS numbers would be grades 10-12. We believe the aforementioned numbers would place approximately 300+ schools in each of the divisions. We have been informed that 962 schools play football within California.
- The only teams that will be considered for the state championship games will be section champions.
- We do not support any additional games at this time, such as regional bowl games, or city championship games. We absolutely believe that the three games should be called “State Championships” because the best of the best is being invited. This is also a tremendous marketing tool for the State CIF.
- We believe we provided conservative quotes for revenues, and expenses should not exceed those that we submitted. I contacted the Southern Section and used their actual cost as a guideline for the games. These costs may increase with the addition of a third game, but so should the revenues. The figures presented in the original document were taken from past games played by possible opponents in a game of this magnitude. Those numbers may change with the inclusion of a third game. We believe football may be the only new championship sport that could generate a profit for the State CIF. The profit that could be made from these games will depend on the possibility of sponsor(s). John Tarman can provide you with the best information regarding the marketability of state championship football games.
- We did not forward any specific criteria to the committee because it is our belief that a football advisory committee, composed of representatives from the 10 sections, should be convened to develop statewide criteria. I believe this was the same process that was used in the development of the criteria that is used for volleyball and basketball. The criteria could include head to head competition, records against common opponents, strength of schedule, strength of section among common opponents, etc. The committee may decide to include the media to help select the teams or allow them to make the presentations at the selection committee meeting. There are a couple of media outlets that currently use a power rating that might be examined as a possible tool in the selection committee. In fact, the state of Ohio uses a power rating system to select and seed its football teams for their regional and state playoffs. The final criteria would be determined by the football advisory committee.
- There should be another committee, called the selection committee, that would select the teams. There could be a north selection committee and a south selection committee to respectively select the teams from their region. It is our belief that each section would have one representative on the committee. Each section would select their representative with the only criteria being that the individual should not be affiliated with any of the schools that could be nominated to play in one of the three games.

The above recommended changes are included in the attached document, which is on our letterhead and is numbered 1-11. There were no changes made to the document, “Policy and Procedures for New Events.”

Recommended times are listed below, but could be changed by State CIF staff according to facility and other needs.

Small School Game-----12:00 p.m.
Middle School Game----4:00 p.m.
Large School Game-----8:00 p.m.

3. ****ENROLLMENT RANGES**

The CBEDS numbers for grades 10-12 will be used to determine the game for which each school could qualify. The ranges are as follows:

Small School Game--Enrollment range of 0-900
Middle School Game---Enrollment range of 901-1500
Large School Game---Enrollment of 1501 and above.

NOTE:

- The only schools that can be nominated for any of the three aforementioned games are section winners from each of the ten sections.
- The north selection committee would have a total of 24 schools, broken down into three divisions to pick their three teams. The number of section champions by section are: CCS-4; NCS-7; Northern-6; Oakland-1; SF-1; and SJS-5.
- The south selection committee would have a total of 23 schools, broken down into three divisions to pick their three teams. The number of section champions by section are: Central-5; LA-1; Southern-13; and San Diego-4.
- If a section does not have a team that qualifies for the large school game, they may submit the winner of their largest division game as their large school nominee.
- It would each section's decision to either submit the said school as their large school nominee or allow them to be considered for the game that reflects their enrollment range.

4. ****SELECTION AND NOTIFICATION OF TEAMS**

There would be a need for two committees to be convened. They are:

- The first committee would be an advisory committee that would be representative of the ten sections. This committee would have a number of functions, that would include, but not limited to, approving the criteria for selection of the teams, determination of the final timelines for selection of the teams, final determination of the game site and times, etc. This committee would serve the same functions as other CIF state sport advisory committees.
- The second committee would serve as the selection committee. Each section would have a representative and their would be two selection committee; one for the six sections in the north and one for the four sections in the south. Each section would have one representative on the committee. Each section would select a representative for the committee. The criteria that the selection committee would utilize to select the teams would be two fold. They would use the same criteria that is currently used in the basketball and volleyball seeding meeting for our state tournaments. They include head to head competition, strength of schedule, records against common opponents, etc. Our proposal also recommends that the advisory committee study the concept of a power rating system that is currently used by calpreps.com as a tool to help select the teams. The state of Ohio currently uses a power rating system to select and seed their state football tournament. The selection committee would make their decision after reviewing all the above information and making the best decision possible.
- This is a very delicate issue because sections finish their playoffs at differing times. In the north, all section finals are completed by the first week in December with the exception of the Division I final in the Sac-Joaquin Section. In the south, three of the four sections have their section finals in the second week of December with the exception of the Central Section, which finishes the first week in December. Therefore our recommendation would be for both selection committees to meet on the following dates: Monday, December 6, 2004; Monday, December 5, 2005; and Monday, December 4, 2006. The north committee would be able to select the team that would represent their area in the middle and small school games. They

may be able to determine the large school game or at the very least, should be able to narrow the choices down to two teams, depending on the outcome of the Sac-Joaquin Section Finals on the next Friday. They could convene by a conference phone call on the Saturday following the SJS finals to make their selection for the large school game.

The south committee has a much more difficult task because a number of their finals will be taking place on the following Friday. They should be able to narrow their choices down to a couple of teams in each division and then convene on the Saturday following the finals to make their final decision. It is our belief that these meetings should be held in strict confidence and the teams should only be announced when the decision is final.

The north selection committee would be able to announce their middle and small school teams upon completion of their meeting on the appropriate Monday. The announcement of the large school team from the north could be delayed, depending on the outcome of the SJS final.

The south schools should be announced on the Saturday or Sunday following the section finals.

5. GAME SITE

It is our position that the game should be played in Southern California due to the unpredictable weather in the north. The site should be determined by the State CIF staff, as they will want to follow the protocols that have been established with RFPs.
