b) Schools who qualify as an automatic entry, and schools interested in applying for an at-large berth shall submit a written application with complete information being faxed, emailed or hand delivered to the North Coast Section office by 9am on the day of the at-large/seeding meeting.

3) The selection panel will be responsible for the selection of at-large teams and seeding for each division of their assigned gender. The At-large & Seeding meeting would be a closed meeting. As each division bracket is completed NCS staff will post on the NCS website.

Rationale: It was generally felt by the committee that the one year pilot program for basketball was very successful and was a much more streamline method for selection and seeding of the basketball tournaments, therefore this would be a good time to proceed with additional sports using the same procedure.

Pros and Cons regarding the At-large & Seeding Process

The following were comments made by committee members concerning the At-large & Seeding Process

1. Coaches ranking – league coaches voting in a block to help each other
2. It is the feeling to some individuals that the criteria for selection are not always followed by the committee.
3. Many times a committee will miss information on the board that affects the selection of at-large teams and seeding of the tournament.
4. Committees don't have enough time to evaluate the information on the board.
5. The person chairing the committee can have great influence on the success of the committee. Finding a good chair for every meeting can sometimes prove to be very challenging.
6. The presence of coaches and spectators in the room puts a tremendous amount of pressure on the committee.
7. Some committee members don't say a word and just agree with other committee members.
8. Sometimes the information on the board is incomplete.
9. The non-voting chair of the meeting is not allowed to say anything directly to influence the committee.
10. In many meetings, especially the larger brackets, the committee member just can't digest the information on the board.

Rationale: It was generally felt by the committee that the one year pilot program was very successful and was a much more streamline method for selection and seeding of the basketball tournaments, therefore the committee would like to phase in more sports using this process.

- (5) Mixed doubles

b. Brackets will be developed according to the following procedures in sequential order:

- (1) There will be no seeding
- (2) Champions will be separated in the first round.
- (3) First, second, third and fourth place qualifiers from the same league will be placed in opposite halves by draw.
- ~~(4) Quarter brackets will separate the top four qualifiers from each league.~~

e. d. Any out-brackets for a fifth qualifier, supplemental placement, or new league, to the formula draw will be decided by out-bracketing the first #4 seed that will not upset or create an imbalance in the draw.

**Badminton: Modify the USA Badminton rules regarding coaching**

**Motion to modify the USA Badminton rules and not allow coaching in the first or second games at the 11-point break.**

**14.100H NORTH COAST SECTION MODIFICATIONS****1. 14.101H Badminton Lines**

One-inch (25.4 mm) lines are permitted.

**2. 14.102H Coaching Intervals**

There will be an interval of 90 seconds between the first and second games, and not exceeding 5 minutes between the second and third games. Coaching is allowed during both intervals. Players will not be allowed to leave the court during the 90-second interval without the Umpire's permission.

**14.203H Alternates**

A player or players may be entered in one event only. Alternates will not be allowed to play unless they are listed on the entry form submitted by the league. A player may not be listed as an alternate if he/she is listed as an entrant in another event. *Alternates will not be allowed to participate unless included by the league representative prior to the end of the coaches meeting.*

**14.509H Participants Uniforms**

Participating team members at the NCS/Les Schwab Tires Badminton Championships must comply with the following team uniform requirements.

- 1) All players on a team must wear shirts of the same color and the same trim pattern, but not necessarily the same material. A single partial/whole manufacturer's logo/trademark (no more than 2 1/4 square inches with no dimension more than 2 1/4 inches) and/or one American flag (no more than 2 inches x 3 inches in size) are permitted on the shirt. The shirts do not have to be manufactured by the same company.
- 2) All players on a team shall wear shorts of the same color and the same trim pattern but not necessarily the same material. A single partial/whole manufacturer's logo/trademark (no more than 2 1/4 square inches with no dimension more than 2 1/4 inches) and/or one American flag (no more than 2 inches x 3 inches in size) are permitted on the shorts. The shorts do not have to be manufactured by the same company.
- 3) Players may wear sweat pants during competition provided they match the color of the team's shorts. All of the sweat pants worn in competition must have the same trim pattern. The sweat pants material does not necessarily have to be the same material. A single partial/whole manufacturer's logo/trademark (no more than 2 1/4 square inches with no dimension more than 2 1/4 inches) and/or one American flag (no

more than 2 inches x 3 inches in size) are permitted on the sweat pants that are worn in competition. The sweat pants do not have to be manufactured by the same company.

**PENALTY FOR VIOLATION:** Participating teams and/or players who wear illegal uniforms will be subject to the following procedures: *disqualification once a match has started.*

- a. ~~Offending teams and/or players will be asked to correct their uniform error\*.~~
- b. ~~If an offending team and/or player cannot correct their uniform error they will be disqualified.~~

<sup>2</sup>Lower Lake shall compete in the Coastal Mountain Conference's league qualifying track and field meet. When a Lower Lake athlete(s) place in the top four (4) of the CMC meet he/she qualifies (up to three entrants per event as stated in the National Federation Rules Book Rule 4-2-4c on page 21) to the NCS/Les Schwab Tires Redwood Empire Track & Field Championships.

NOTE: This action may require an additional heat at the NCS/Les Schwab Tires Redwood Empire Track & Field Championships in all races that are run in lanes.

<sup>3</sup>The number of qualifiers for the Tri-Valley Area Championships from each of the league meets will be as follows:

- 1. ~~When a nine lane track is used for the area championship, each league shall have six (6) qualifiers from their respective league championship meets.~~
- 2. ~~When an eight lane track is used for the area championships, each league shall have five (5) qualifiers from their respective league championship meets, and the sixteenth entry will be the individual with the next best qualifying mark (time, height, or distance) in each event from the league championship meets.~~

<sup>4</sup>Branson School and Justin-Siena shall compete in the Marin County Athletic League's league qualifying track and field meet. **25.406H Track and Field Qualifiers by Affiliation**

Qualifiers from league or NCS/Les Schwab Tires Classification Championship Track and Field meets may advance to the next post-season meet regardless of school affiliation. (This rule supersedes the limit of 3 entrants from the same school contained in the Track and Field Rules Book).

**L. PASSED(CONSENT)****Lacrosse: Include Lacrosse with Football and Wrestling in Note 4 of the Sports and General Bylaws**

NOTE 4 Varsity teams in non-contact sports (not football or wrestling **or Lacrosse**) may participate in one game or scrimmage with its own alumni or faculty without the game or scrimmage counting against the maximum number of contests allowed. (This alumni or faculty "game" does not count as a scrimmage or a contest.)

Rationale: Lacrosse is a contact sport.

**M. PASSED(30-0-0)****Schools are allowed only one Varsity level team per sport**

Motion to approve limiting each school to one Varsity level sport. The Varsity level team is the only team that is potentially eligible to qualify to the NCS/Les Schwab Tires Championship events.

Rationale: This would keep a level playing field for each school.

**VI. NEW BUSINESS****A. PASSED(26-0-2)****Five Divisions in the sports of Baseball and Softball**

Motion to develop five Divisions in the sports of Baseball and Softball. This proposal would combine the Redwood Empire and East Bay similar to the sports of Football, Volleyball, and Basketball. (ATTACHMENT A)

Rationale: 1) Less likely to have incomplete brackets, i.e. 6 teams in an 8-team bracket which happened in the 2A Redwood Empire Softball bracket for the past 3 years.  
2) This would create a more diverse bracket rather than a bracket filled with teams from the same league.

**B. PASSED(22-6-1)****Award two NCS Elmer Brown Award of Excellence Pennants (1-girls' and 1-boys')**

Motion to award two NCS Elmer Brown Award of Excellence Pennants. One pennant to a girls' program and another to a boys' program. Currently this award is a school award for the school's entire program for both athletic and academic prowess.

Rationale: The schools with only one gender currently will not have the opportunity to compete for this award.

**C. PASSED(27-2-0)****Track & Field: Elimination of Bylaw 25.709H Hardship Rule  
25.709 Hardship Rule****ACTION**

The "hardship rule" is designed to provide consideration for the outstanding and deserving athlete in the Section, who through an extenuating circumstance is prevented from participating in the Class A and Area Championship meets and thereby from qualifying for participation in the Meet of Champions competition. The following procedure will be observed:

1) Application for consideration will be presented to the NCS Class A or Area meet director in writing by the coach before the meet starts, giving name, event and circumstances. The applicant must be a league designated qualifier/entrant to the NCS/Les Schwab Tires Class A or Area Championship. The Qualification Committee, which will consist of the NCS/Les Schwab Tires Class A or Area Championship meet director, and the NCS track representatives from each league represented in the NCS/Les Schwab Tires Class A or Area Championship meet will act on "hardship case" application immediately following the meet and its decision will be final.

2) A league designated qualifier/entrant granted favorable consideration by the committee will participate on the following Tuesday or Wednesday in a run-off, throw-off or jump-off in competition with the last place potential qualifier of the NCS/Les Schwab Tires Area Championship meet. Each contestant will be allowed four throws or jumps in the shot put, discus, triple jump or long jump. The competition will be held on a neutral field, and at a time selected by the committee in cooperation with the two coaches.

3) The third place finisher in NCS/Les Schwab Tires Class A and the seventh place finisher in the NCS/Les Schwab Tires Area Championship will not qualify automatically to the NCS/Les Schwab Tires Meet of Champions. They will be approved for section competition only by action of the Qualification Committee following consideration of "hardship application" if any and after implementation of the above procedure when necessary.

*(NCS Board of Managers 10/25/03)*

Rationale: We are the only section that allows this rule. A player who has won a contest and given a spot to go forward may be notified that they must meet someone and do the event again to re-qualify. This is not fair at all to the athlete who has won the spot following all requirements to have someone state they were ill or injured and could not participate. Team sports do not have the ability to state a player was ill or injured during an important contest so they get to play the contest over or at a later date. This rule does not seem in the spirit of fair competition.

**NCS Water Polo Petition to move to Two Divisions for NCS Playoffs**

We spoke about this issue at the NCS coaches meeting and the open format seems to be the best format to go with to keep everyone happy. No system will be perfect but the "open" format seems to be the format that is most practical. The petition was unanimously approved by the Mission Valley Athletic League coaches. I'm asking you to contact your Athletic Director and support this petition so it gets pushed through.

We've been through many different types of scenarios and formats but the open division seems to be the one scenario that keeps all parties happy and with the CCS Football moving to that format there is a precedent in place. This format will appease the "powers" and the "developing" schools in the water polo.

\*The North Coast section is the ONLY section in California that does not have multiple divisions for both boys and girls. In Northern California the Central, Central Coast and San Joaquin Sections ALL have multiple divisions for both genders.

**Central Coast Section (56 teams according to their website) - supports four 12 team tournaments (2 divisions for boys/girls)**

**San Joaquin Section (61 teams participating according to John Williams Asst. Commissioner) - supports two 16 team tournaments and two 12 team tournaments**

**Central Section- supports two 16 team tournaments and two 12 team tournaments**

**OPTION 1)**

**PETITION for two divisions “OPEN” Division and “Bay Division”.** After much thought and discussion I think the best and only route to go would be to follow the Central Coast Sections Football’s lead and create an “Open” division for water polo. The CCS created this division for football after Valley Christian and other schools with lower enrollment would routinely beat teams in their division by large margins.

This competitive inequity is the same thing we see in water polo. The best teams if you take a look at the CBED figures are the smallest schools. Creating divisions by solely looking at enrollment figures would not solve the biggest issue which is allowing more kids to compete for a section banner. It would also upset Monte Vista, San Ramon and De La Salle since they wouldn’t get to compete against their traditional rivals and would “roll” through the big school division. Miramonte and other traditional 2A schools have voiced displeasure that they would not get to compete in the big school division and also compete against their traditional rivals.

This is the format used by the Central Coast Section for Football. The Open Division would be open to any team but would definitely include the champion of the the power leagues. I think that this is far and away the BEST option and would keep all parties happy. The opportunity to play in the “OPEN” division would be available to any team.

**Pros:**

- 1) Better competitive balance in respective tournaments
- 2) More teams have the chance to compete for a NCS banner
- 3) best teams get the opportunity to compete against one another:
- 4) Interest at schools that are not traditional power will increase and benefit water polo in the area as a whole
- 5) Water Polo in the North Bay and other areas of the section are growing rapidly.

**Cons:**

- 1) Teams “tanking” games and not applying to the OPEN division. (this has not been the case in the CCS football playoffs)
- 2) Goes against traditional NCS model of going by CBED (time for change see CCS football model which has been very successful).

***Why have 2 divisions why not stay with the current format?***

***OPEN vs traditional CBED?***

Water Polo success is not directly related to your student population. Berkeley, Deer Valley, Washington, Amador Valley, Newark Memorial, Irvington, Foothill, Antioch, James Logan have 2,000 students plus and beautiful facilities but struggle to compete with schools from more affluent areas such as Orinda, San Ramon which draw 3 times as many kids with enrollments under 1,500. Many of the 2A schools field freshman teams while a vast majority of the 4A football schools struggle to field junior varsity teams.

- At the very least the NCS needs to move to two divisions since the change is long overdue. The next step is choosing the correct format. As you’ll see splitting the divisions purely by enrollment will not solve the problem and could be a point of contention for San Ramon, Monte Vista and De La Salle since they’ll be stuck in the big school division where they won’t get to face their traditional rivals. Miramonte, Campo and Acalanes would also not get to compete for the big school division. This is a point of contention in the current CCS water polo (not to be confused with the “open” football division. In many years past the top two teams in the section were in separate divisions. Many CCS coaches have expressed displeasure that they can not crown a true champion. Having an open division would solve this problem.

- You can’t let the small schools petition up to the big school division in the CBED format because then you’ll hurt the smaller school division by them losing a majority of their teams. CBED format also does not allow the large schools to move “down” a division despite them being more on an equal playing field with schools with significantly lower enrollments.

Taken from the CCS website for their OPEN division Format:

All schools wishing to play in the "Open" Division shall submit a completed **Division Declaration Form** (See APPENDIX for [DIVISION DECLARATION FORM](#) - Football) **on or before the 3rd Monday in October** of the current school year. After legally submitting its Division Declaration Form, a school may not then rescind its declaration at a later date.

Example Open Division: Teams petitioning up forming a 8-12 team bracket (depending on response that year) If an overflow as cited in this example. Teams seeded #13 and #14 will be allowed to compete in Bay Division.  
(14 teams petitioned by October 3<sup>rd</sup> deadline and attend 10 am seeding meeting)

Teams that filled out paperwork: Monte Vista, De La Salle, Carondolet, San Ramon Valley, Miramonte, Acalanes, Campolindo, Las Lomas, Northgate, Sir Francis Drake, Marin Catholic, Ygnacio Valley, Foothill and Amador Valley

Bay Division 1pm seeding meeting: would then select 8-12 team bracket from the teams that showed up to NCS meeting from the remainder of the NCS member schools that didn't petition up or were not selected for "Open Division" (teams 13 & 14 in this example)
