So, the number of contests actually played would not exceed two past the games guaranteed.

Exception:

Volleyball: Each day of participation in a volleyball tournament shall count as a maximum of 2 matches in determining the maximum number of volleyball contests allowed per school.

~~Baseball and Softball: Each baseball and softball tournament shall count as a maximum the number of guaranteed contests in the tournament. Any additional games beyond the tournament guaranteed number of games shall not count towards the maximum number of games. Baseball and softball teams will be limited to a maximum of three tournaments.~~

Badminton: Participation in a badminton tournament counts as two contests for each day of competition when determining the maximum number of contests allowed.

NORTH COAST SECTION EJECTION POLICY

ATTACHMENT A

SOCCKER 2003-2004

The following is a summary of the rules pertaining to the NCS Ejection Policy in soccer. This summary is provided for athletic directors, coaches and league commissioners. Athletes may be disqualified from competition for many reasons according to National Federation rules. This summary outlines which rules will apply to the NCS Ejection Policy. **Please review these rules with your student athletes.** However, any act by an athlete that is unsportsmanlike or dangerous conduct shall subject the student to ejection and application of the NCS Ejection Policy. It is important to note that a one game or contest ejection is not a substitute for appropriate counseling of the student, nor for the student's demonstrated contrition and acceptance of responsibility for the action(s) which led to the ejection. The one game or contest suspension is the universal penalty for ejection from a contest but in no way is it a substitute for a school's and coach's responsibility to provide appropriate counseling, remedial action, and discipline. Each league shall establish a procedure for reporting ejections (NCS Sports & General Rulings Handbook - Bylaw 307H).

Coaches Review Content

League commissioners shall have coaches review the content of the Ejection Policy for the coaches' respective sport at the end of the season meeting and make recommendations for change. The league commissioner will direct such recommendations to the NCS Sports Advisory Committee ("SAC"), which will consider them. The SAC will determine whether to forward recommendations to the Board of Managers for change.

Coaches' Responsibility

Coaches are responsible for determining the cause of ejection for any of their players and are responsible for enforcement of the Ejection Policy. Confusion over the cause for a player's ejection shall not be the basis for allowing a student who has been ejected under an applicable rule to avoid the sanctions required by the Ejection Policy (either prohibition from participation or forfeiture should a student who is in violation of the Ejection Policy play in a subsequent contest).

(Board of Managers 10/24/97)

Note: Any act by an athlete that is unsportsmanlike or dangerous conduct shall subject the student to ejection from the contest and application of the NCS Ejection Policy will apply.

NCS SCHOLARSHIP FOUNDATION PROPOSAL

February 20, 2004

Proposal: To establish an NCS Scholarship program that recognizes school nominated student athletes from NCS member schools who have demonstrated excellence in academics, citizenship in the school, and community service. Recipients would be selected using the existing criteria and process from the NCS/Nabisco Scholarship Program. The amount of scholarships will be \$1000 and \$500 and the number presented will be determined by the funds raised through Foundation Games as outlined below. Scholarships would be presented at a North Coast Section banquet only if a corporate donor sponsors the program and/or banquet. Otherwise, the scholarships would be mailed to the recipient's school to be awarded at the appropriate school function.

Funding source:

The NCS Scholarship Foundation will be funded from a 50% share of revenues from the gate receipts for Foundation Games in boys' basketball and girls' basketball. The Foundation Games may only be conducted under the following guidelines:

- DATE:
Foundation Games will be played on the last Tuesday of November. **Please note that only foundation games may be played on the foundation date. No other competition at any level is permitted.**
- Only varsity level competition is permitted.
- GAME TIMES:
7:00 for a single game
6:00 & 8:00 for a double header.
- CONTRACTS:
Schools must agree to a two-year contract. The contract must be signed by both principals and returned to the Section office for final approval. The contract form is available by clicking on the link on the NCS website (www.cifncs.org).
- MEMBER SCHOOLS ONLY:
Both participants must be North Coast Section members. Out-of-Section play is not allowed.
- TICKET PRICES:
Adults--\$5.00
Students--\$3.00
Due to the benefit nature of this program, no passes of any type will be honored.
- CONTACTS/COMPUTER RATINGS:
Games do not count toward the NCS 26-contact limit and are not calculated in the school's computer rating (if applicable).
- OFFICIALS:
The home team is responsible for securing officials (officials may agree to waive their fees for these games).

GATE RECEIPTS:

Half of the gate receipts (after expenses) are to be forwarded to the North Coast Section office with Foundation Game Invoice Form. The invoice form is available by clicking on the link on the NCS website (www.cifncs.org).
