

Blingum's Bob Newman, Undlin Into State Meet

Stein Out On Tossup

B E R K E L E Y — Burlingame High School qualified two men hurdler Bob Newman and pole vaulter Jess Undlin—for the California State track-and-field meet here next Saturday in last Saturday's star-packed North Coast Section finals, also held here in US's Edwards Stadium layout.

Blingum's Dick Stein also qualified with four others in the pole vault but lost out on the split-flip.

Edwards State meet, only the first of three placers here last Saturday are considered.

Newman, running the best flip of high hurdles in his youth career, took second by a nose behind Piedmont's Monte Upshaw in a three-event winner on Saturday.

Newman also took second behind Upshaw in the lows, won in the transitional time of 18.8. Undlin took second in the pole vault behind Mt. Diablo's Stan Gaunt, who won the event at 12 feet, 10 inches. Undlin cleared 12 feet.

ONLY ENTRANTS

The two Blingums are the only North P.A.L. entrants who qualified for the State meet.

But another P.A.L. performer, San Jose Lincoln's Don Bowden was one of the meet's three standouts, along with Upshaw and Alameda's speed-burner, Jim Jackson.

Bowden set a new national interscholastic half-mile mark of 1:52.3 in winning his special

by Besides winning the highs in 14.5 and the lows in 18.8, Upshaw also won the broad jump with a leap of 24 feet, 9 1/4 inches. His 14.5 equaled the NCS record. His 18.8 tied the national interscholastic mark and his 24-foot, 9 1/4-inch broad jump leap was only two inches behind the national interscholastic mark of 24-11 1/4 set by the fabled Jesse Owens at East Tech, Cleveland, O., in 1933.

Newman won his 100-yard dash heat in 9.4, fastest century recorded in the U.S. this year, regardless of high school, college or club affiliation, and the 220 in 21 flat. Both his efforts were new NCS records. He also anchored the relay team to a new NCS mark of 1:38.4.

Newman's race against Upshaw in the highs was one of the day's thrillers. The Burlingame speedster went ahead of "Marvelous Monte" at about the fourth hurdle and maintained his lead through the last hurdle. Newman hit the ground after the last hurdle just a shade ahead of Upshaw but the Piedmont runner made up the difference in the race to the tape and won by only a matter of inches.

The finish was so close that the spectators had to wait for the official decision before knowing whether Upshaw finally had met his master in the high sticks. As it turned out, he hadn't but it was awfully close.

Saturday's State meet also will be held here in Edwards Stadium. Trials will start at 10 a.m. Finals at 1:30 for field events and 2 for track events.

Burlingame High school's varsity track team has a fourth place in the North Coast section championships to go along with the Peninsula Athletic league title and runner-up berth in the group two N.C.S. meet

The Panther foursome of Bob Newman, Jess Undlin, Dick Stein and Roger Peterson racked up 18 1/2 points to trail champion Alameda, 29; Richmond, 28, and Piedmont with 24.

Highlight of Saturday's meet at Berkeley, however, was turned in by Lincoln's Don Rowden, who broke the existing national 880-yard record for the second time this season with a 1:52.3. Alameda's Jim Jackson ran a :09.4 century and Piedmont's Monte Upshaw had an :18.8 in the 180-yard high hurdles to equal national marks.

John Sutherlin leaped 21 feet 4 inches for a fifth in the broad jump to account for San Mateo. High Bergesen picked up Capuchino's two points with a fourth in the broad jump

San Mateo's shotput ace, Gino Della Libera, fouled on his only qualifying effort to miss a berth in next week's state meet.

Newman was the Panther's top performer, placing behind Upshaw in both hurdles events. The Panther ace was clocked at 14.5 in the 120-yard highs, the same winning time given Upshaw which equaled the meet record.
